Born in 1974 in Kaunas, Lithuania and now working in Vilnius, Lithuania, artist Eigirdas Scinkas has dedicated himself to the pursuit of artistic mastery. Casting aside the confines of black & white fashion and portrait photography, Scinkas immersed himself in the boundless world of art, drawing inspiration as well as learning from the luminaries and giants of the art world, who have come before Scinkas, while forging his own path of discovery.

For the artist, the artistic journey knows no bounds. Like the graceful jellyfish, Scinkas navigates the currents of creativity with fluidity and grace, embracing the ebb and flow of inspiration without hesitation. In every brushstroke, he finds solace, surrendering to the transformative power of emotion and the boundless depths of the human spirit.

For Scinkas, the process of examining his own practice is endless. Much like the artist's recent main subject, the jellyfish, Scinkas doesn't confine himself into a particular rhythm or pattern, thus he allows himself time and lets faith take its own course. Scinkas says: Jellyfish symbolizes acceptance and faith, surrendering to the waves without struggling or sinking in emotionally challenging times, being able to stand without solidifying in difficult conditions, their sensitivity to the water element transpires in the same emotionality that I carry'. The artist uses the same philosophy in his life and practice.

Since 2013, Scinkas organises annual exhibitions in Lithuania and the EU, as well as wider Eurasia - Germany, Kazakhstan, Spain, Lithuania, includes merely a few. Recent shows include: *Depth*, AP Gallery, Vilnius, Lithuania (2024); *Free Swan*, Meno Materija Gallery, Kaunas, touring to Villa Komoda, Palanga, Lithuania (2021); *Abstract World*, Aukso Pjūvis Gallery, Vilnius, Lithuania (2015); *Deep Sea*, Esentai Gallery, Almaty, Kazakhstan (2018). During his career, art lovers and collectors from all around the world have purchased over 400 abstract paintings for their beloved spaces from Scinkas.

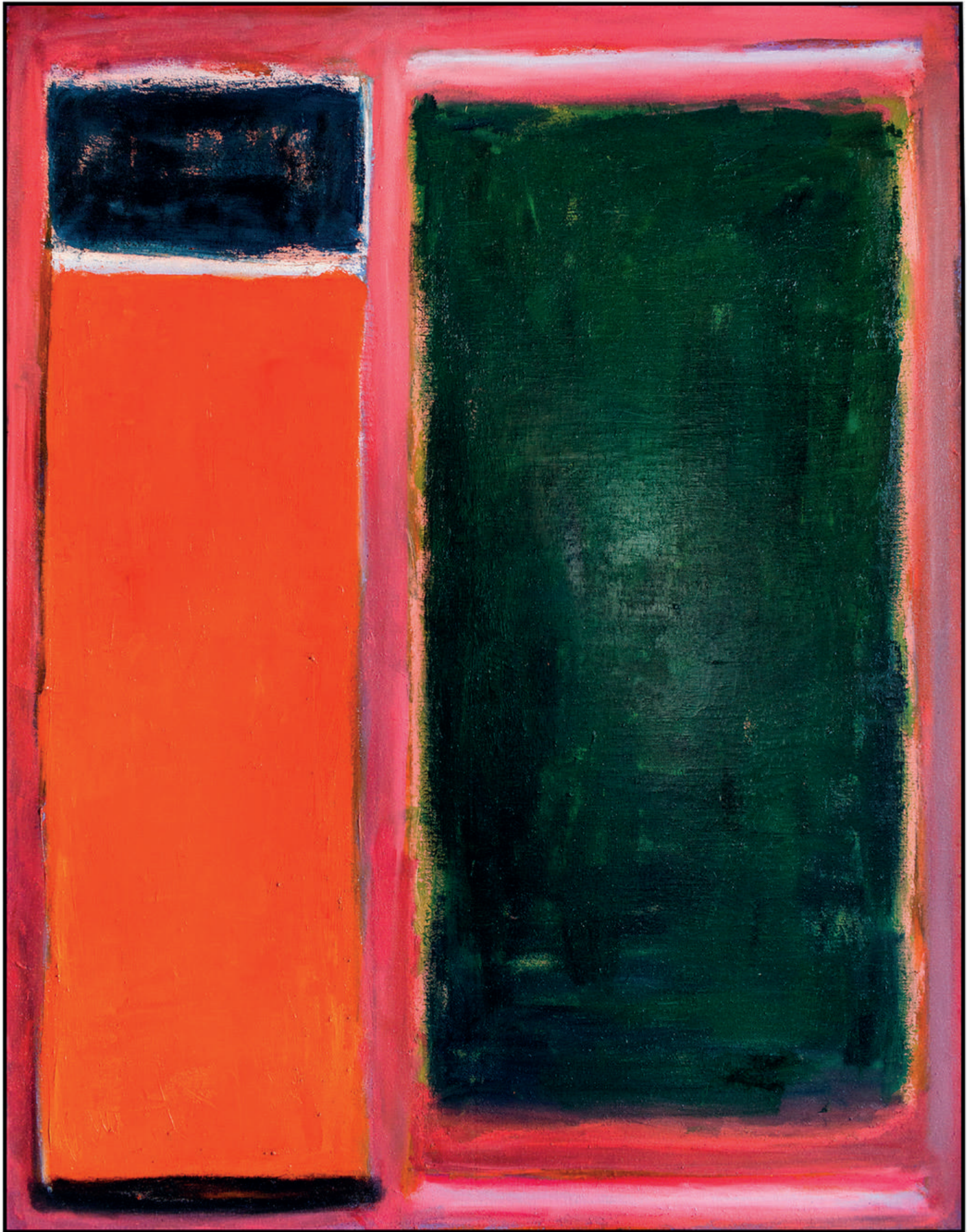

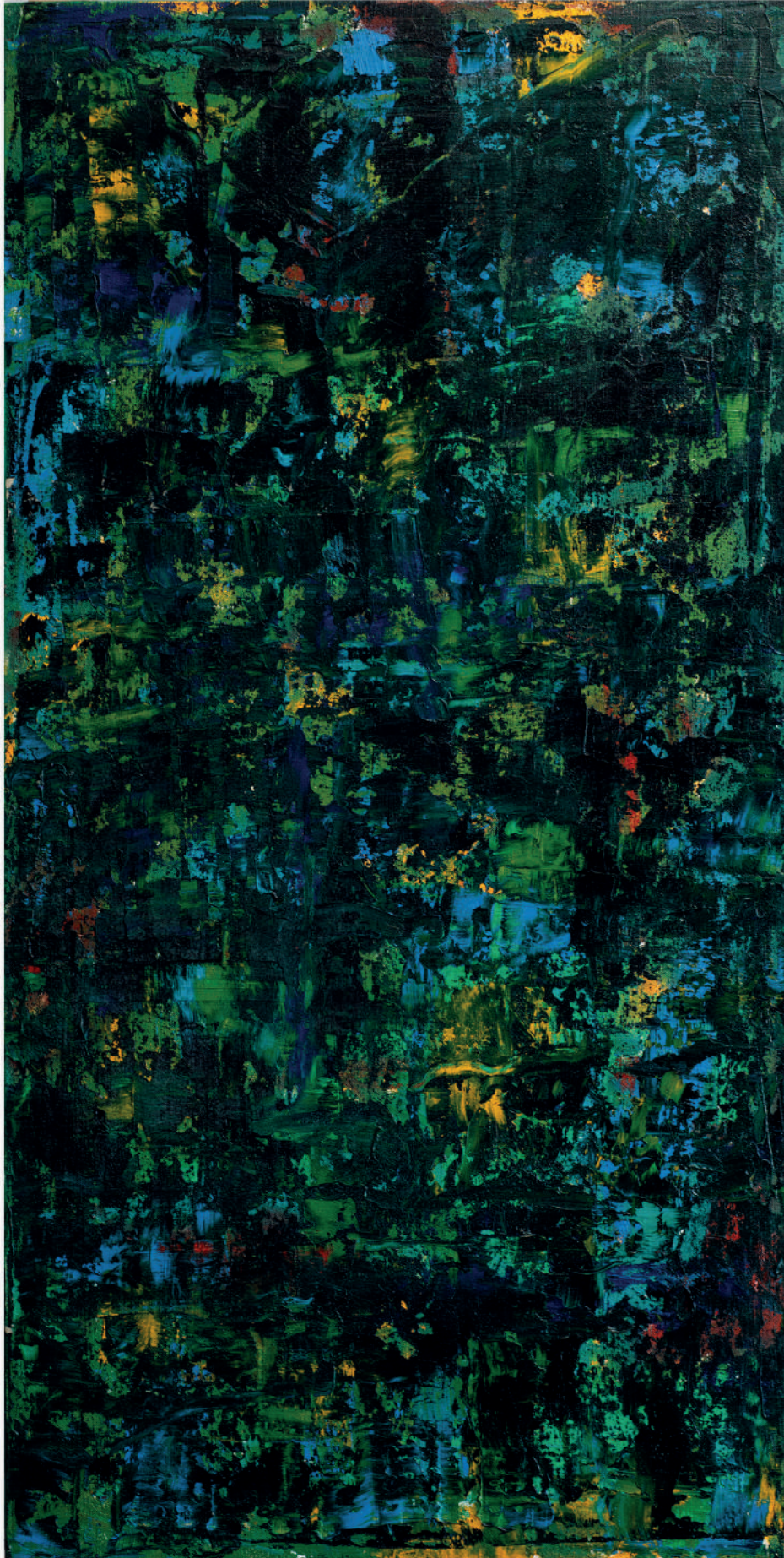

Indeed, Scinkas' artistic evolution from cubistic and Rothko-inspired canvases to more rounded and abstract figurations reflects a significant development in his practice. Ultimately, Scinkas' work serves as a testament to the transformative power of art and the endless possibilities for growth and evolution within the creative process.



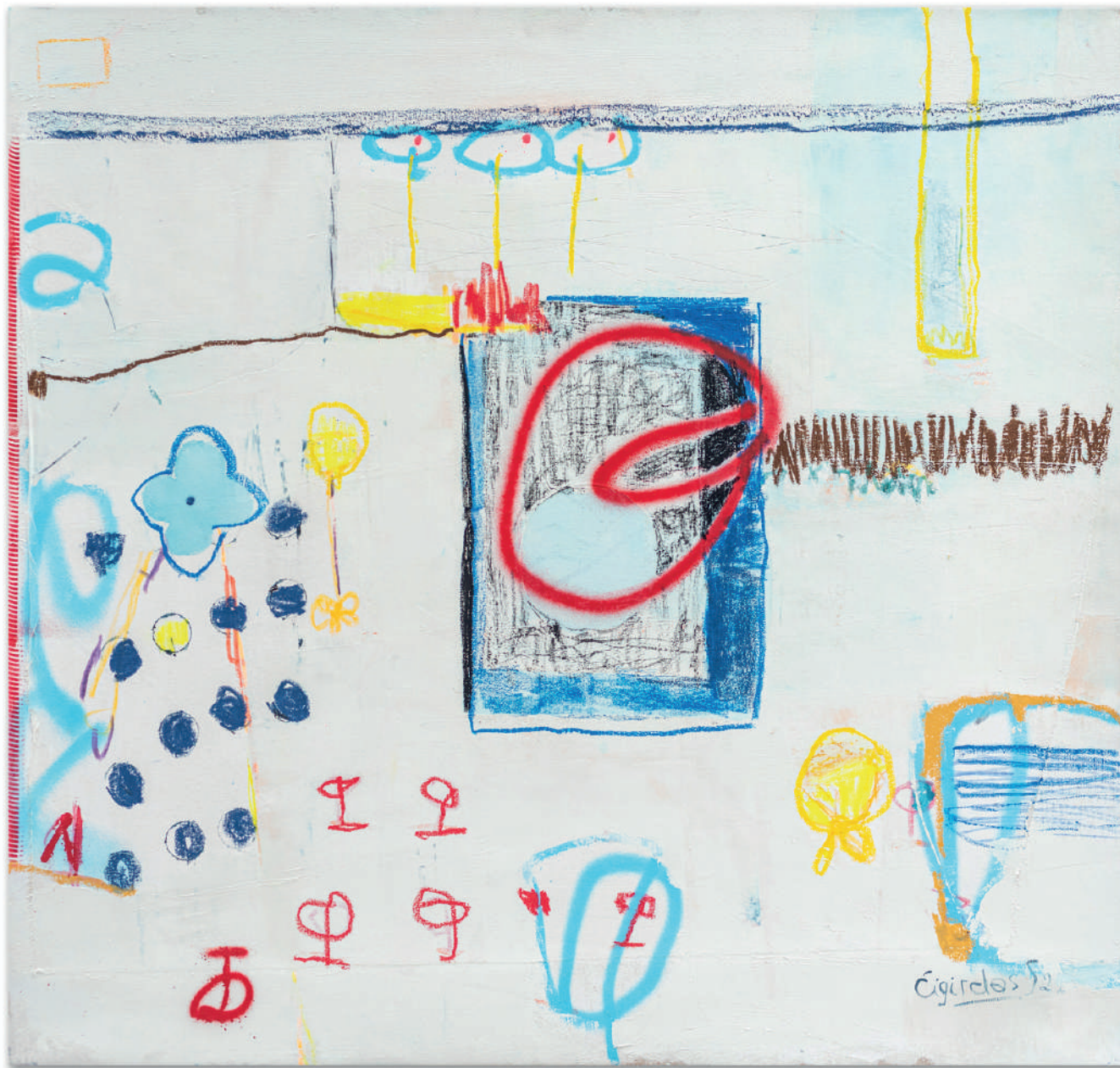

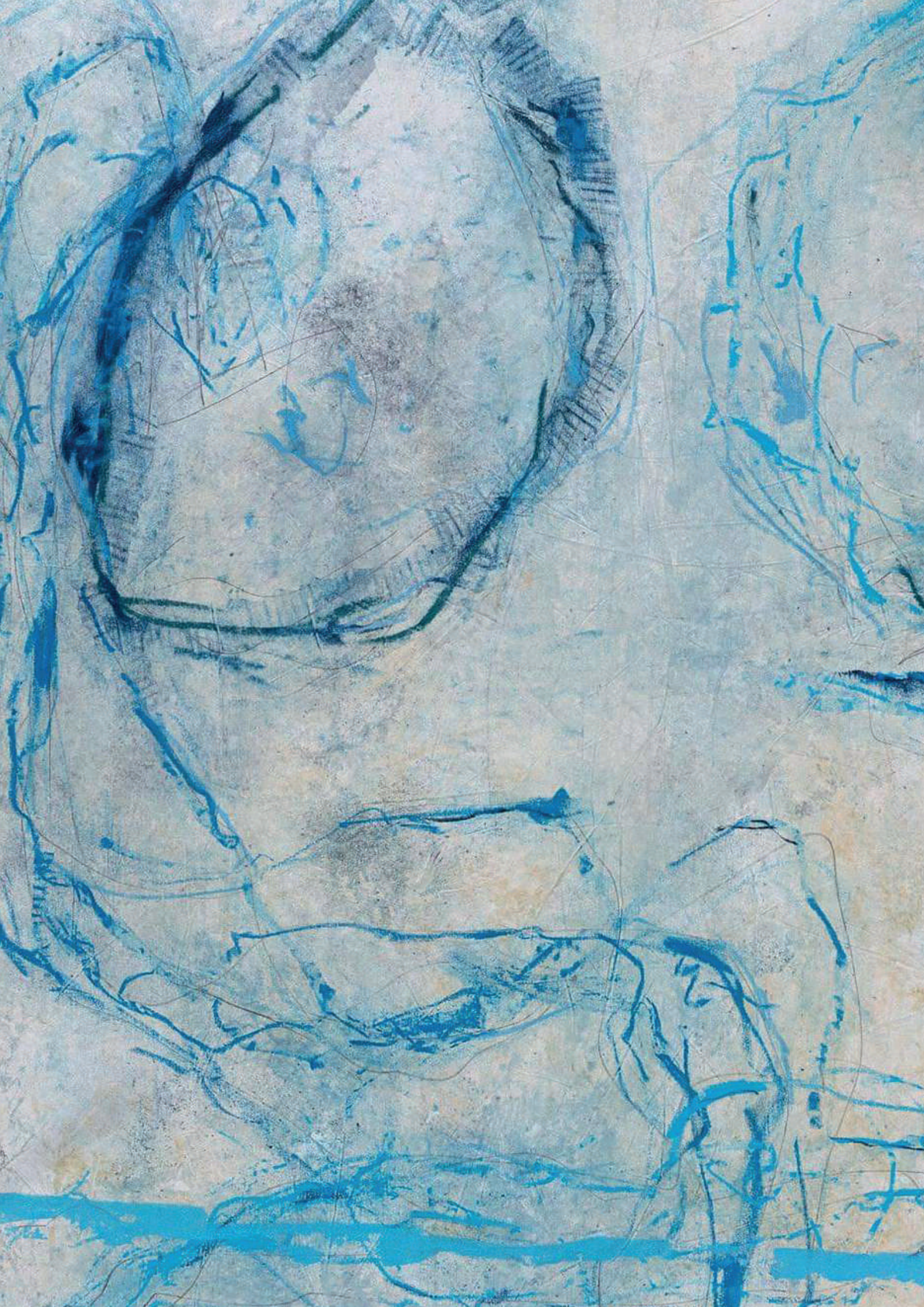

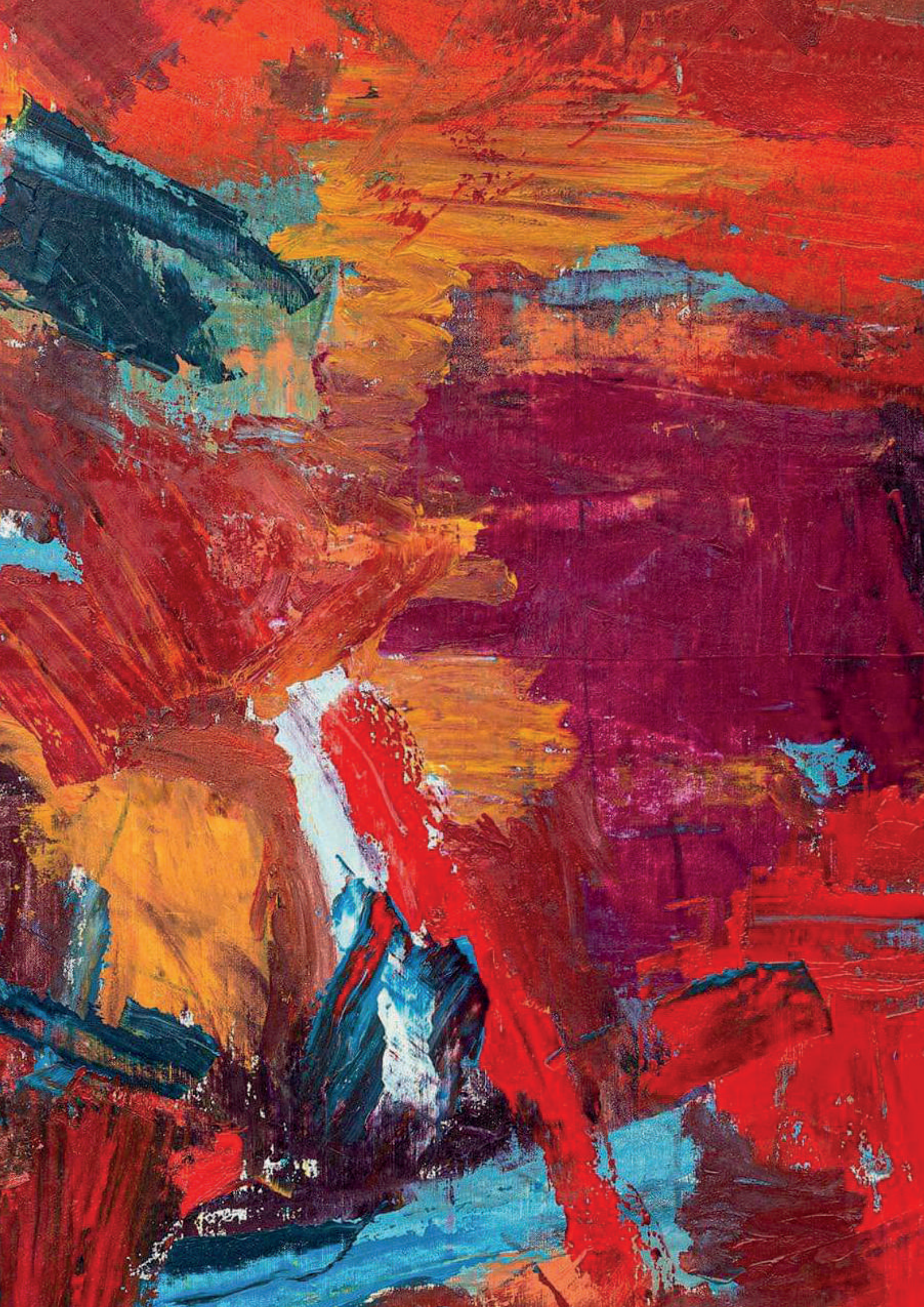
